Peter Ripa joined the Century Club of San Diego, a 501 c(3) nonprofit organization, as Chief Executive Officer in July 2011. The Century Club is responsible for planning and executing the Farmers Insurance Open, San Diego's PGA TOUR Event. The organization is composed of 12 staff and more than 45 San Diego business and community leaders dedicated to the mission of uplifting San Diego and local charities. This is achieved through the Event's broad economic impact and programs that utilize the profile and magnitude of the Event to provide fundraising, engagement, awareness and experiences for charities, local military families, community organizations and schools.

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- More than \$25 million economic impact for the City of San Diego including more than \$6 million in local hotel revenue
- Excess of \$3 million in funding and in-kind value delivered to charitable partners annually
- · Unmatched exposure for San Diego to 227 countries and over 1 billion households globally through nearly 20 hours of live broadcast on CBS and Golf Channel delivers unmatched
- In 2015, one of The Century Club's long-standing partners, Monarch School, was recognized as the PGA TOUR's Charity of the Year. The Monarch School is the only comprehensive K-12 school in the country developed specifically to serve homeless students. As PGA TOUR Charity of the Year, Monarch School received a \$30,000 grant, as well as a 30-second Public Service Announcement (PSA) to be aired throughout the PGA TOUR season, bringing awareness to the issue of youth affected by homelessness and inspiring a call to action to become part of the "village" that it takes to end the problem.

It is Peter's belief that our success is borne from a collaborative community striving toward a common goal. He believes each individual; Century Club members, Tournament volunteers, sponsors, community partners and the public, play a significant role in achieving the mission of hosting a world-class PGA TOUR event to maximize support for the San Diego community and local youth programs. ••• Peter previously served as the Tournament Director at the PGA TOUR's Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial in Fort Worth, Texas for five years. Colonial was recognized with four PGA TOUR "Best of Awards" - Most Engaged Community, Best Marketing/ Sales Plan (twice) and Best Use of Players. ••• Prior to his role at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial, Peter served as Assistant Executive Director of the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA), Georgia PGA, Florida State Golf Association and Innisbrook Resort over the last 30 years. ••• Peter is a graduate of University of South Florida, B.A. Finance and Kennesaw State University, M.B.A. Marketing. He currently serves on the Board for the San Diego Tourism Authority and completed two terms on the Board for the PGA TOUR Tournament Advisory Council (TAC).














riting a bio for ROTD is perhaps the reason I never did on line dating- I mean where does one begin and how do I not bore you to tears???
