He began his speech reminding us of the days popularity was measured by the amount of Valentine's day cards you received in the third grade, before reminding us of the heartache that ensues from rejection, providing an example of his most recent bout of it from former president Rick Binder. With another year of life he's matured from Statler and Waldorf status with his partner in crime Jim Davies on the community service committee to become the chair - from heckler to heckle-e.

Plans include updating the polar's post, painting ALL the doors in the barracks and replacing a stolen sign – if you're attending **March 7th**, you're in for a DAY. **Connor** reminded us about the Wapi project, happening this Sunday, the **23rd at 11 am** and provided us with lined paper with a pen to sign up since the QR code proved difficult for many the week before. **Ranjan** reminded us of the pathways to peace committee which plans to meet April 24th at the Preuss school to install a peace poll: the day will include a big dedication ceremony and include folks from UCSD, thanks to **David** and **Marty**. Beethoven's Ode to Joy was created for the whole world, and indeed, it is the soundtrack for the founding of the United States of America. He ended the presentation reminding us truth plus beauty equals freedom, and classical music allows us to incorporate these principles into our daily lives to become better ourselves and in turn, make the entire world better.

For those interested in attending one (or all) of the concerts, Garrett wanted you to know: There is a one-hour wine reception before the concert and the concert is only an hour as well - we like to balance the social and artistic experiences.
