

development, just three seasons after serving as a graduate manager and completing his master's degree from the University.

Shelton earned his bachelor's degree from SDSU in 2011. The third-year director of player development assists with video breakdown, film exchange, travel, community service and many of the day-to-day office duties. Shelton took over for long-time staff member, David Velasquez, who was elevated to assistant coach prior to the 2013-14 campaign. A native of Fresno, Calif., Shelton played five seasons on Montezuma Mesa and saw action in 109 games while helping the Aztecs reach the postseason in all five of his campaigns, including three consecutive NCAA tournament berths. He is one of four players in the Steve Fisher era to have won three Mountain West championship rings. Shelton, who earned a spot on the 2012 Mountain West all-defensive team, was a member of the record-setting 2010-11 squad that captured the Mountain West regular-season and tournament championships, won the school's first Division I NCAA Tournament game, advanced to the Sweet 16 and finished with a record of 34-3.
