served as Rotary International President 2015-16 with his Presidential Theme: Be a Gift to the World. As President he brought in a business like management style to Rotary, seeking productivity, demanding accountability and emphasizing transparency at the Board and at the operational level. He cut operational expenses down by over USD 2m and his convention brought in a profit of over USD 2.5m. He is currently Chair-Elect of The Rotary Foundation and will serve as the Chairman in 2020-21.

Ravi is CEO of a publicly listed company which he founded with a worldwide clientele in the tea packaging industry. He also serves on the board of several other companies and charitable trusts.

Since completing his term as President, Ravi has been busy working with and involving Rotary in several large-scale projects of national importance in Sri Lanka.

Previously as his country's national PolioPlus chair, Ravi headed a task force consisting of the government, UNICEF, and Rotary and worked closely with UNICEF to successfully negotiate a ceasefire during the (then) on going civil war during National Immunization Days. He has been and continues to be involved in several other major projects of national importance and chaired their acclaimed Schools Reawakening Project to build 25 tsunami-devastated schools to benefit 15,000 children at a cost of approximately \$12m. He continues to be involved in his business.
