Sal Maracello *"Fantastic Life after Cancer"*

In 1900 average life span was 46.5 years, lots of diseases were prevalent. Many of those have been conquered.

In the USA now it is 78.7 years. Now we have some cancers, heart disease

How did cancer get its name? Cancer looks like a crab, a mass in the center and metasized in the body. Most cancers can be treated successfully.

Sal said men don't like to talk about their health. But they need to be mindful of their prostate. Good news and band news. Prostate cancer is in 1/3 of the men.

Sal talked about his options – surgery, radiation, little radioactive pellets, radiation 60,000 more than the dentist uses. He looked for other options, and found the California proton Center. This is a very tightly targeted option; it destroys only the cancer cells.
