Sully talked largely about the Chargers and the stadium. The number one industry in the world is tourism. Every game in the stadium is a 2.5 hour commercial for San Diego. game has a \$750,000 impact on our city. To get the Super Bowl requires new stadium. He made the case that the cost of new stadium on current land is very small. Repairing the stadium will cost \$50,000,000. A new stadium could be used for used for Chargers, Aztecs, concerts, truck rallies, and much more. The current stadium has the biggest parking lot west of the Mississippi. He would advocate moving the stadium to one side, and then develop rest of the lot with housing and a UTC like development. This is NOT about lining pockets of millionaire, but about a civic asset. The stadium is owned by the city, and it will get the revenue. The Chargers use the stadium only 8 times a year, and they pay for that use. Questions from the club created a very lively conversation.



For those of us founding members of the club, it seems like we are always being ROTD. So I'll do a quick recap for the newbies and the rest can go back to sleep.
