Shamail Amiri was born and raised in Afghanistan in a city controlled by the Taliban. In spite of the violence and intimidation that the Taliban leadership brought to Afghanistan and the strict prohibition of schooling for girls her parents decided to send her to underground school. This was particularly dangerous because her family belonged to the Hazara community. The Taliban declared that killing Hazara people was a way to heaven!

When she was in 9th grade she taught girls in elementary school and encouraged other parents to allow their daughters to go to school. At this young age she believed that "human rights" and "gender equality "were values and ideals that many people take for granted. Because of her experience she developed a strong desire to ensure that all people (especially women and girls) would

be guaranteed these inalienable rights.

When she finished high school, **Shamail** decided to continue her education because it was her mother's goal for her to do so and take care of her six younger siblings.

She graduated from nursing school and has worked with national and international organizations such as the **Norwegian Afghanistan Committee** (NAC), which was the primary health care provider in most areas in her Afghan community. She traveled to many different areas in Afghanistan to train other women and men to become community health workers.

She created her own nonprofit organization called "Afghan Women and Children Capacity Building." in order to provide literacy courses and training in weaving, sewing, and family planning. She has also run for parliamentary election of Afghanistan in 2011 and received multiple death threats from the other male candidates!

In 2012 she came to the US, alone and unable to speak or understand English, continuing to worry about her six siblings left behind in Afghanistan.

Shamail is now attending UCSD and has chosen Political Science/International Relations as a major with the minor in Law & Society. She continues to work as a volunteer with the International Survivors of Torture organization and she wants to examine issues around women's rights and explore legal means to assist women and children who are

the victims of sabuse.
