Bruce S. Kahn, MD, is a gynecologist experienced in minimally invasive surgery at Scripps Clinic. Dr. Kahn treats general and complex gynecologic conditions including uterine fibroids, ovarian cysts, endometriosis, menstrual disorders, menopause symptoms and infertility.

With extensive subspecialty training in urogynecology, Dr. Kahn also provides treatment for pelvic pain, interstitial cystitis (painful bladder syndrome), urinary incontinence, overactive bladder and pelvic organ prolapse.

Dr. Kahn offers non-surgical solutions or minimally invasive surgical procedures for his patients whenever possible. As a member of the Scripps Minimally Invasive Robotic Surgery Program, he performs a wide range of robotassisted gynecologic surgeries including the removal of masses and fibroid tumors, as well as hysterectomies. Committed to ensuring that his patients benefit from advancements in women's health care, Dr. Kahn regularly leads clinical trials of devices and medications to reduce pelvic pain and improve gynecologic care.

Dr. Kahn earned his medical degree from Georgetown University. He completed his medical internship at Cedars Sinai Medical Center and his residency training at Abington Memorial Hospital. He is chairman of graduate medical education at Scripps Memorial Hospital La Jolla and adjunct professor of obstetrics and gynecology at Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences.

When not caring for patients, Dr. Kahn enjoys bicycling around San Diego and skiing the slopes at Mammoth Mountain.
