At the regular meeting of our Club, our Foundation will hold its annual meeting of the Members of the Foundation on July 10, 2020 to hold an election to reelect Steve Brown, Pam Russell and Eric Freeberg to continue to serve as Directors of the Foundation.



Our breakfast small groups begin at 7 am; just log in to our meeting earlier than usual, and you're already in a breakfast group! **President Kim** called the meeting to order at 7:30, introducing **Krishna Arora** as Rotarian of the Day. For reflection, **Krishna** shared a quote beloved by Rotarians: You must be the change you wish to see in the world. **If unhappy, don't complain**; instead create means to improve the situation.
