

El Niño and storm impacts on our coastlines and estuaries:
A WINDOW INTO THE FUTURE?

Dr. Giddings is a coastal physical oceanographer specializing in estuarine and coastal processes with an interest in interdisciplinary projects that address how physics impacts important biological and chemical processes in the coastal environment. She uses a variety of scientific approaches ranging from field experiments that directly measure water properties and movements to numerical models that simulate flow in coastal waters. She started

as an Assistant Professor at Scripps Institution of Oceanography in January 2014 in the Integrated Oceanography Division. She is currently involved in several research projects around the world, including several locally in Southern California. Dr. Giddings enjoys extending her passion for estuaries and coasts to the community through scientific outreach and through teaching.

Prior to joining SIO, she was a National Science Foundation Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of Washington, School of Oceanography, from 2012 – 2013, and a Postdoctoral Research Associate University of Washington, School of Oceanography, from 2011 – 2012. She received her M.S. and Ph.D. in Civil & Environmental Engineering from Stanford University, and her B.S. in Civil & Environmental Engineering from Berkeley.

Our speaker was none other than Irwin Rubenstein's talented daughter, Ione Stiegler. She regaled us with the history of the extensive remodeling of the Audrey Geisel University House for UC San Diego.

It was a 5 year project funded with donated monies and completed on time. The total cost was about \$10 million dollars with Audrey Geisel being the largest donor. The entire La Jolla Farms area was once owned by Mr. William Black who chose the very edge of the cliff to build his 11,000 square foot home. While excavating, Indian bones from a burial ground were found as shallow as 6 feet down! Canine "human detection" dogs were used to pick up the scent of ancient remains (dogs would sit down on remains when they found them). An archeologist was initially hired to sift thru the top 6 feet of soil, replacing that soil with "sterile" or new soil. At that time the geologist could then begin his work. A \$1,000,000 wall was constructed to shore up the cliff. Everyone involved in this project was very conscious of the sanctity of the grounds to the point of putting down a plywood road over culturally sensitive land so no tires touched the land. Great care was taken to utilize the light and magnificent views. IS Architecture did a beautiful job restoring this historic home, good job Irwin raising such an accomplished daughter!

"Dennis Bucko, M.D., a San Diego based board certified plastic surgeon specializes in cosmetic surgery of the face and body, but twice a year he volunteers his reconstructive surgical skills with the Mercy Outreach Surgical Team. M.O.S.T. is a volunteer organization composed of physicians, nurses and members of our community dedicated to providing surgical care to children in greatest need in Mexico.

"On M.O.S.T. trips, I see people who are in desperate need of reconstructive surgery, and our being there is the only way they'll get it. That keeps me going back. It feels good to be able to change someone's life in just an hour with a simple surgery," says Dr. Bucko. "You enhance the lives of children and their families, but you also impact the way they interact in their community."

Dr. Bucko recalls a teenage boy on a previous trip who had a cleft lip that had never been repaired. Living in isolation on the outskirts of town, the boy had placed black electrical tape over his lip to hide his deformity. (Ideally, the team hopes to reach children while they are still young, just 2 or 3 months old, before they suffer the pain of their abnormality. In some cases, however, those who seek surgery are well into adulthood.)

In addition to volunteering his surgical expertise, Dr. Bucko is dedicated to



raising awareness and financial support for the M.O.S.T. program. He has donated a portion of his surgical fees at his cosmetic surgical center to the program, and has also generated support through his local Rotary Club, La Jolla Golden Triangle. M.O.S.T. works closely with Rotarians in Mexico, so sharing his experiences with his local chapter and facilitating a cross-border relationship with Mexican Rotarians has been rewarding for Dr. Bucko.

"Each trip is unique," says Dr. Bucko. "We never know exactly what kinds of cases will be waiting for us when we arrive in a new community. But when our bus pulls up in front of the local hospital early on that first morning we are always greeted by several hundred people, many who have traveled long distances from their homes, waiting with babies and young children wrapped in blankets and their hope that we can make a difference. It's an awesome sight.

"Being able to help is a pretty powerful feeling. The response we get...tears of joy and smiles...it's incredibly rewarding," says Dr. Bucko. "And, it's a privilege to be a member of such an amazing team of volunteers, many who pay their own expenses and give up personal vacation time to participate, and who genuinely care about the patients and their results."*
