# Program Summary: Hands of Peace by Sarah Heirendt, San Diego Site Director

Hands of Peace is an interfaith organization

that empowers young people to raise their voices as leaders of change. Through the power of dialogue, Palestinians, Israelis and Americans partner to achieve peace, equality, freedom and justice. Hands of Peace believes that youth are key to building a better world. Providing a safe space for youth to share their pain and build trust is key to the organization's success.

Hands of Peace was founded in 2002 in the Chicago area by members of the Christian, Jewish and Muslim communities—who shared the conviction that peace could be nurtured, person-by-person. The organization expanded to San Diego in 2014 and has received support from many clubs in District 5340, including LJGT. The organization received the 2020 Peacemaker of the Year Award from District 5340; at the end of the meeting Sarah was presented with the LJGT Rotary Club's Peacemaker of the Year Award. Rotarians can become involved by serving as host families, providing financial support, and volunteering for special events and governance activities. Hands of Peace includes a Summer Program, the XL Program, and Alumni Clubs. The Summer Program brings a group of Jewish Israeli, Palestinian citizens of Israel, and Palestinian teenagers to Chicago and San Diego for a 19-day, dialogue based experience. After their first summer, graduates of the Summer Program are encouraged to apply for a second time, in a new and enhanced leadership role, as part of the Excel (XL) Program. A critical component of the Hands of Peace experience is participating in Alumni Clubs, which keep participants connected in a variety of ways, including quarterly retreats for Middle East participants and the opportunity to visit the region for American alumni. Hands of Peace counts 650 alumni who pursue peace through working in influential positions in government, media and politics.





My hometown is Milwaukee, Wisconsin, home of brutal winters, gorgeous summers and the Green Bay Packers (yes, I have a cheese head!). When I was a teen, my family moved to South Florida, home of brutal summers, gorgeous winters and the Miami Dolphins.

I attended Florida Southern College for my freshman and sophomore years, spent a year abroad at the University of Madrid, and received my BA from Florida International University. After grad school, I spent 8 months roaming around Western Europe with my ex-husband, living in our car and loving every minute of an extraordinary adventure.
