I was born in Glendale, California in 1943 as a 4th generation Southern Californian. My wife, **Nancy**, also was born in Glendale. Although we lived about a half-mile from each other for 3 years, we didn't meet until we were Accounting majors at the University of Southern California. When we met it was "love-atfirst-sight" for me. With an on-and-off relationship it took her the next 3-1/2 years to warm up to the idea of marrying me. We have now been married 48 years.

We moved to Cardiff from LA with our first child in 1971. We later had 3 more children, three of the four are fellow USC Trojans. The other, Ted, is a USD Torero. Our children knew we would pay their tuition to most any college, but if they wanted to go to UCLA they could pay for it on their own.
