Maddie Hamann grew up in a small town north of Columbus, Ohio. She studied Civil and Environmental Engineering at the University of Notre Dame, and during her undergraduate studies she conducted research with coastal engineers and hurricane modelers that led her to discover the unfamiliar world of physical oceanography.

She is now in her fifth year of graduate study in Physical Oceanography at Scripps Institution of Oceanography and has spent over 150 days aboard research vessels observing dynamics that drive turbulence and mixing in the ocean. Her thesis work is focused on observations made in the La Jolla Submarine Canyon, wherein persistent turbulence drives deep, nutrient-rich water into the vibrant Marine Room ecosystem. In addition to observing and understanding the ocean, Maddie is deeply interested in how our scientific understanding of the planet can be communicated to and reflected in the daily lives of people everywhere.

She attended COP23—the 23rd UN climate change summit-to learn about the international community's efforts in climate change policy. She is also currently the lead artist for a large art installation called Ocean Tunnel that is intended to communicate how ocean ecosystems are affected by climate change and unsustainable fishing practices.

ANTONIO J. Grillo-López MD, DSc (hc) Rancho Santa Fé, California

Dr. Grillo-López specialized in Hematology/Oncology at the University of Puerto Rico. He was Program Director, Hematology/Oncology and held faculty appointments there and at the University of Michigan (Associate Professor of Medicine). He has authored over 400 publications and co-authored the international response criteria for lymphoma. Dr. Grillo-López has been instrumental in the development of over 25 anticancer agents. He was Chief Medical Officer (IDEC Pharmaceuticals) responsible for the development of Rituxan and Zevalin ((1st antibody and 1st radiolabeled antibody for cancer). He has served on several advisory boards including: National Coalition for Cancer Survivorship, and UCSD Cancer Center. He was the Industry Representative to the Oncologic Drugs Advisory Committee (ODAC) of the FDA from 2003 to 2007.

Dr. Grillo-López is active in the San Diego community. He is a member of the Rotary Club of La Jolla Golden Triangle where he has served as President, on the Board of Directors, and has chaired the Club Service Committee. He is a Rotary International Paul Harris Fellow and a member of the Paul Harris, Arch Klumph, and Bequest Societies. He has Chaired the Board of Directors of the House of Puerto Rico San Diego and was the Founder and Director of the Museum of the HPRSD in Balboa Park. Dr. Grillo-López is also active in the Saint Therese of Carmel Parish. He chaired the Advisory Board and was a Trustee of Notre Dame Academy in Carmel Valley, Catholic Diocese of San Diego, California. He is on the Board of Trustees of the Hope Funds for Cancer Research and on the Board of Directors of the Preuss School, UCSD. He has been awarded a Doctorate in Scientific Investiga-

tion (honoris causa) by his alma mater, the University of Puerto Rico School of Medicine.
