
native Southern Californian, I Agrew up in Orange County during the "Leave it to Beaver" era of the 50's and 60's. My boyhood was largely spent playing sports, surfing and fishing. At age 10-12 I was a water boy for Santa Ana Junior College and that connection later led to a 3-season stint as the batboy for the California Angels. While working for the Angels, I enjoyed my "15 minutes of fame" as the American League batboy for the 1967 All-Star game. During my batboy stint, I learned the finer points of pitching from the likes of Bob Lemon, Lew Burdette and Johnny Sain... it was this coaching that enabled me to play college baseball at San Diego State despite never playing high school baseball.
