

PRESENTATION OF THE DAY

Today's presentation was by **Rick Clark** and **Steve Colwell**, who told us about the creation and construction of a new memorial a Camp Pendleton honoring the 2,706 Marines of the 1/5 Regiment who were killed in Vietnam. The memorial wall was completed and dedicated in 2018.

Rick began the presentation with a video showing the history of the 1/5 Regiment and their legacy of bravery and sacrifice. **Steve** then talked to us about the genesis of the idea for the memorial and the drive behind creating a monument worthy of the memories of 2,076 Marines who were killed in action during Vietnam.

Steve reminded us that the Memorial Day is not about veterans per se, but about honoring the lives of those soldiers who gave the ultimate sacrifice in the performance of their duty to our country. Steve asked us to remember those who had fallen and that, when we look upon the names of the fallen, we should ask, "Who were these men?" They were young men, in their late teens and early twenties, whose lives were cut short and who left behind fathers and mothers. life and love. Despite the brevity of their existence, their impact and their sacrifice and their names should never be forgotten.


