Dr. Antonio Grillo-Lopez walked us through the various steps it took to find such a cure for Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma, a very deadly cancer for which there was no medical cure only the traditional methods which were not very effective. The antibodies go after the lymphoma blood cells, marrow cells then to the lynpth node cells but the distribution of the antibody is less effective down stream. In combining with a new drug, Zevalin, this is now becoming a more effective treatment. Zevalin along with its predecessor Rituxan is saving over 50,000 lives annually and this is now going on 18 years. Rituxan the top selling anti cancer drug in the world and has saved lot of lives including one of my employees.

President Kim Schafer honored Dr Antonio Grillo-Lopez for his great work and closed the meeting.
