Dr. Grillo introduced our speaker, Scott Barton, principal of the top-ranked Preuss School to talk about the school and its mentoring program. The school selects low income students from throughout the county who will be among the first in their family to graduate from college. Preuss' success is attributed to many factors - the longer school year; a single track approach where all students take the same courses; tutors and a Saturday program for those who need extra help; a parent academy and parent engagement; professional development for teachers; an advisory program for students involving character development; tables for team work replacing desks, etc. Currently the Mentor Program has 65 mentors who meet with students 1-2 times a week. There was much interest in Preuss from Rotary members as evidenced by the numerous questions and the close relationship we have with the school through several joint projects.
