La Jolla Golden Triangle Rotary Club Impact Projects. President Kim pointed out that there is so much impactful work happening behind the scenes that most people don't know about. We are seeking to expose these good efforts.

Steve Brown; Water Project. Initiated in 2014 as a joint partnership effort between UNESCO-IHE, Univ. of Delft Netherlands, and Oregon State University Problem: 7 countries that share the same water basin but no common planning (Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, Afghanistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Pakistan). Body of water is the Aral Sea and has shrunk dramatically.

Solution: Bring people together from all these countries to start a conversation. Initiated 2 week workshop covering water conflict management to build trust, cooperation, and action plans. Effort involves multiple different government agencies and grants exceeding \$1 million.

Fary Moini: Women's Sports in Afghanistan.

Problem: Up until this effort there existed no facility or program for women's sports in Afghanistan!!

Solution: Applied for grant to support women's sports program. Funding from US Embassy, Sister City Foundation resulting in 12 teams teams with 864 females participating in table tennis and volleyball and cricket. Furthermore, the program is using this platform to discuss other important issues including women's health and body issues that are normally taboo bringing about truly impactful change and empowerment.

David Chong introduced our speaker: Chris Busher, Parkinson's Association San Diego, Rotarian. www.parkinsonsassociation.org Chris' cell phone: 858-999-5671

202 years ago in England, Dr. Parkinson identified the disease. \$Billions have been spent since on finding a cure. Chris is encouraged by research and development which currently looks very promising. In the meantime SD Parkisons Assoc. serves an important need since current system and specialists are completely overwhelmed. What is Parkinson's?: Brain cells make dopamine, they stop working or die. It's a movement disorder. The experience of living with Parkinson is unique for each individual person. It has stages. The mission of the Association is to provide information, resources, and education. The goal it to keep people in the early stages as long as possible. There is no way to prevent the disease but people can learn to live with it and manage it. National Foundations are focused on research and finding a cure. However, local foundations are here to help people that are living with the disease.

Good Start Program: Neurologist. Specialists have a case loads of 700-2000. 6M have this disease worldwide. Intro training on how to deal with Parkinson. 60k are diagnosed each year in US.

Association Booklet: Free transportation to any related Parkinson event or support group. Medical Device Support Program, free donated devices for people that need them. Parkinson fundraiser walk every April.

Parkinson's Support Groups: 17 support groups throughout the county. 50-120 people attend each group. These are incredibly valuable resources. So much important knowledge sharing and community. Planned giving.

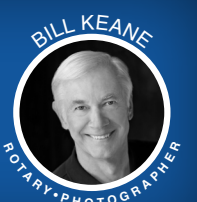
