2,500 films were submitted this year to the festival, and it has been narrowed down to around 120 that will be shown this year throughout the 5-day festival. The festival will be held at 2 venues downtown and in the UTC/La Jolla area from October 10-14 and feature screenings, parties, celebrations and awards. Kenny Loggins will be receiving an award this year. The kickoff film is Can You Ever Forgive Me and stars Melissa McCarthy in the lead role.

Film festivals have shown to be huge economic drivers in communities, and this one has been no exception. Film festival tourists typically spend 3-4 times more than the average tourist. **Tonya** fielded several questions and invited us to attend this year's festival.
