THE VALLE DE GUADALUPE: THE NEW DARLING OF THE WINE WORLD

A retired San Diego banker, George Haligowski has done what so many of us can only dream of: he makes wine! (And Gold Medal winning wine, at that.)

Capitalizing on his business acumen and leadership skills, George envisioned his "retirement" as an opportunity to celebrate his love of wine and fine art. He moved from Rancho Santa Fe to Baja and spent years navigating the regulatory and cultural hurdles of building there before opening the Palazzo Del Valle last summer. Featuring Tuscan-style architecture, George's boutique resort has quickly become one of Valle de Guadalupe's most spectacular new, private bed and breakfast destinations.

Designed in a classic agritourismo palazzo style, eight suites surround an open courtyard, each themed after a renowned artist: for example, Salvador for Salvador Dali, Pablo for Pablo Picasso. The Palazzo is a jaw-dropping showcase of sculpture, art and artifacts curated from George's decades of international travel. "If you travel around the world and go to Tuscany, Burgundy, Bordeaux or even Napa Valley, the very nice palazzos, villas and chateaux also have great art. I wanted to bring this European concept to the Valle de Guadalupe," says Haligowski.

When George opened the Palazzo last summer, his foray into winemaking received immediate acclaim, capturing the Gold Medal for his 2021 Nebbiolo Crianza at the Mexico International Wine Competition. It wasn't exactly an overnight success – Haligowski and his talented winemaker, Gustavo Meillon, had been working together for nearly five years to earn their place among their fellow Valle de Guadalupe vintners.

Given the strain on natural resources in Baja, George's mission at the Palazzo includes a commitment to sustainability, including deployment of greywater recirculation, rainwater catchments and solar.

Today's presentation focuses on the Valle de Guadalupe's international reputation as a premier wine region — and on George's personal journey to take his place among the legendary winemakers and hosts of the Valle. To view the Palazzo, visit palazzodelvalle.com.


