# THE CONFIDENT LIFE PROGRAM\*: A SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) CURRICULUM PILOTED WITH SAN DIEGO COOPERATIVE CHARTER SCHOOL

Stephen Tako and Sarah Saluta will present together, for the first time, the results of this program and the effect it has had on the 90 students enrolled. Plus, they will discuss the importance of implementing a Tier 1 PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports) program for young students.

Stephen Tako, CEO of Motivated To Act

Stephen has been an anti-bullying advocate for over 12 years. As a former victim of bullying, he used his storytelling skills to create the story of a young yeti boy who overcame bullying and discrimination while learning how to make new friends. Since 2011, this original story has developed into three Junga the Dancing Yeti® books which have all been adapted into award-winning animation-style short films. In 2022, he and partner Marzena co-founded Motivated To Act, a 501(c)3 nonprofit, to allow more opportunities for their SEL programs to reach young children. The Junga stories are intertwined within their Confident Life Program™ to provide primary schools with an evidence-based curriculum to prevent bullying and improve social and emotional skills for young students.

Sarah Saluta, Executive Director of San Diego Cooperative Charter School Sarah began her journey as an administrator in 2013 and began working as an Executive

Director in 2019. Her goal as an educator and leader is to innovate, support and inspire. She wants to know every student and parent in her school so that she can support them in their family's educational path.

In her own words, "I believe in our educational philosophy, the focus is on academic excellence but it is through collaboration and critical thinking. Our focus on the whole child is developed through relationships, social-emotional teaching and amazing courses like art, PE, music and dance at all grade levels. I believe strongly in what we do and know that we are innovators in education."
