Brett Morey introduced our speaker, fellow Rotarian **Lisa Cannon** Rodman who is the CEO of the Agua Hedionda Lagoon Foundation.

The 400-acre Agua Hedionda Lagoon in Carlsbad is one of the threatened coastal wetlands on the Southern California coastline. The Lagoon is unique in that it has many current uses such as a YMCA day camp, recreational boating, a mussel and abalone aquaculture facility, a white-sea bass breeding and research center and a power generating facility. The Lagoon's various usages, and the many activities and ecosystems it supports, makes it a distinctive and precious natural resource unlike any other.

The Agua Hedionda Lagoon Foundation is a hands-on organization that believes kids learn from their experiences, and is dedicated to the preservation of the lagoon through education and interaction. During 2019/2020 and Covid pandemic they were visited by 13 school districts and over 10k students. During this time they have enjoyed record membership and introduced new initiatives such as raptors, pre-school program, building trails, Bee-Quarium, and virtual programs.

The foundation engages volunteers in a number of important activities such as assistance with watersport activities, trail maintenance and conservation. The Lagoona Kahuna Challenge is an incredibly fun opportunity to volunteer and meet other people. Sign up to volunteer any shift 9AM to noon or noon to 3PM beginning April 30 and running four Friday's April 30, Ma7, 14 & 21. More information can be found at www. surfersunite.org/events
