CLEAN WATER FOR High Schools in Uganda

Clean water and health are essential for developing nations to thrive. Uganda is a democratic nation in east Africa with much potential. But the government is not able to provide high schools for its people. Consequently, two-thirds of the high schools there are established and built by parents and citizens who see the value of education. The schools are located in rural areas where there is no piped water. Students must fetch drinking water from contaminated ponds and streams, and are constantly sick from drinking the filthy water.

Quench and Connect is a 501(c)(3) non-profit public charity working to provide borehole water wells directly on the campus of schools in Uganda, so that students can have clean water to drink. After the boreholes are in place, students are healthy and ready to study. Quench and Connect strives to improve the education of these students, who will become the future successful citizens of Uganda, and will help lift the nation out of poverty.
