his was a hybrid meeting with some members attending remotely and others attending in person and enjoying tasty burritos at the Marriott. The meeting began with invitations to be seated - with some extra encouragement for Denny - and a reminder regarding mask policies and other COVID-19 precautions.

The Rotarian of the Day is Wayne Davis, the self-proclaimed "forever retiring architect." Wayne described his impressive professional journey as an architect including a brief jaunt into the world of music as a trumpeter. Wayne is currently overseeing a large project under construction, has moved to Del Sur with his wife, and is helping his wife Joy to self-publish tales of fairies and gnomes inspired by stories Joy shares with their grandchildren.

We enthusiastically welcomed guests to today's meeting - even if those of us attending remotely couldn't quite hear their names or details. Welcome just the same!

We next heard from Dr. Antonio Grillo Lopez with the latest on the COVID-19 pandemic. We learned that the Delta variant is taking over and accounts for 87% of all new cases in the US and is 50% more transmittable, although not more deadly. Best practices for prevention are vaccination (44% of the total San Diego County population has been vaccinated), washing hands, wearing masks, and social distancing. Proof of vaccination is becoming a more common requirement. If you're interested in having a QR code and digital copy of your vaccination, visit

The speaker at today's meeting is District Governor Dan Gensler, who has a long and illustrious history of Rotary service and leadership and more professional and community awards and recognitions than this reporter could keep up with! Dan originally joined Rotary to help grow his business as a young professional, but it wasn't long before he discovered a passion and appreciation for Rotary service and its impact on the world. Through Rotary we can change lives close to home, in far away countries, and enrich our own lives along the way.

Gensler shared moving stories such as the inspiring work and selflessness of Sister Ethel, a young Irish woman and Catholic nun doing important work in South Africa; 10 year old Victor whose life was changed by a Rotary funded prosthetic manufacturing clinic in Ensenada; and the 350,000 pairs of Toms Shoes given to those in need at Sister Ethel's Missionvale Care Center outside Port Elizabeth, South Africa.

We are encouraged us to seek out and start Rotary projects, be involved, ask others to become involved, and say yes when opportunities are presented to us. Become familiar with our current projects and opportunities - for example, the District is leading trips to Guatemala for literacy support in February, Kenya in the spring, and is continuing work in Mexico.

Rotary is expanding our reach through the Each One, Bring One. Invite people you know to Rotary you never know whose life will be changed.
