Finally, Rich Papike enlightened us with his crazy humor, Jay honored Bradley Day's last day at our Club and others gave High 5's too. Linda Andrews let Rich know that no one missed him while he was gone! :-)

Our speaker was Gil Cabrera, the Board Chair of San Diego Airport Authority. He gave an informative presentation about the renovations at T1 (Terminal one) which was built in the 60's and maxed out a long time ago. The new terminal will be on top of the existing terminal and the commuter terminal. Parking at the T1 will not improve till 2024. The first

phase with 19 new gates will be done in 2025..overnight, the operations will shift from old T1 to new T1. Then they will tear down part of old T1 and add 11 new gates for a total of 30 gates at T1. The new parking lot will accommodate up to 5500 vehicles...the new entrance will bypass traffic on Harbor Drive. There will also be public transit between the two terminals. San Diego Flyer is a free shuttle bus from Old Town to the airport operating right now.

Visitors will have many options for shopping and dining close to the gates..plus a performing arts area for outdoor activities. I will ask Gil to give me a copy of his very informative 4 minute video presentation, let me know if you want to see it...lots more info than I can provide here.
