David Tansey reported that Pathways to Peace is expanding into content related to racial equity, undertaking the 21-Day Racial Equity Habit-Building Challenge organized by the American Bar Association. Ron Kohl announced an upcoming Rotary Social Distancing Road Rally. Rules are shaping up to be: cars limited to 2 people; most clues answered from within the car; awards for 1st, 2nd & 3rd; no risk of winning because **Kaci Madden** is still on the hook for the next one (and never has there been such anticipation of a Road Rally with all the promotion and pre-hype). The Social Distancing Rally will end roughly around San Diego, with the potential for a hotel option. **Rick Binder** & Janine Pack are planning partners in crime, with Rick commenting "It's going to be messed up". Rick has previously established his authority on this topic. Shooting for the end of Oct for an event date.

Jacquie introduced our speaker Chris Helmer, a SD native who serves as the Environmental & Natural Resources Director at the City of Imperial Beach. Some takeaway facts:

- Imperial Beach is surrounded on 3 sides by water and 3 sides are protected areas, which make up half of Imperial Beach
- 2020 has seen 234 days and counting when the beach has been closed due to waste from the Tijuana River. In the last 10 years, the beach has been closed for the equivalent of 5 years, restricting economic development in Imperial Beach
- Tijuana has 2 million residents, is the fastest growing growing city in Mexico, and is not keeping up with expanding infrastructure needs related to wastewater
- Very little functions in Tijuana with regard to wastewater treatment. Some flows directly into the Tijuana River and into the Pacific. Other wastewater enters the Pacific from the coast. Seasonal Pacific currents running South to North bring additional wastewater to Imperial Beach
- Various funding sources for remediation are the USMXCA Agreement, State of California, and Mexico. These are all inadequate.
- With attention on border security and the new \$2 billion Navy Special Warfare facility North of Imperial Beach, the problem should receive more attention from the U.S. on the federal level

On the water theme, President **Emidio DelConte** wrapped us up with Life Lessons from Noah's Ark. The most apropos for 2020 was: When stressed, float a while.
