



Guest Speaker: Chuck Pretto We were pleased to have Chuck Pretto join us to share a bit about himself and his plans as this year's District Governor. The club heralded his welcome with a hearty standing ovation!

First and foremost, District Governor Chuck began with inducting our two newest members into the club: Matt Clark and Karla Prieto! Both Matt and Karla look forward to giving back to the community and serving with the most DYNAMIC Rotary club in the world. Nancy did the honor of pinning each of our new members; let's give them a warm welcome and be sure to say hello!

Chuck's message focused on a vision of Rotary where people unite to create lasting change in our communities and within ourselves. Service through a youth exchange ultimately helped him realize that Rotary is more than just enlarging one's collection of business cards. Indeed, Rotary is not about what it can provide us, rather what we can give to Rotary and to our community. Chuck has since housed 7 long-term

youth exchanges, hundreds of short term exchanges, served as the Rotaract advisor for SDSU Rotaract Club, and on the Districtlevel as a Rotaract advisor, thus garnering himself the affectionate title "Papa Chuck". Papa Chuck sees it as a joy to nurture and mentor Rotaractors, bringing them through the Rotary experience.

Given these experiences, it is not surprising to know that DG Chuck Pretto is dedicating his governorship to youth mental health. There are two projects he has invited us to consider supporting financially: Rancho Bernardo in collaboration with Vista Hill (P-4266) and Rancho Bernardo Sunrise in collaboration with Rady Children's Hospital (P-4427). Other initiatives Chuck promoted included establishing peace polls in schools with Interact clubs throughout the District (an idea inspired by our very own club) with a promise that RI President Jennifer Jones would visit our district and help commemorate those polls if we secured at least 20 in the District, improving Rotary's branding, and raising money (we do well with our annual fund, but we could improve with our endowment fund).

Nancy thanked Chuck for his visit with an exclusive set of post-it notes and shared her experience of promoting Rotary through her branding.

We then closed out the meeting remembering the pledge of allegiance and with David Oates winning the song guessed.

Antonio J. Grillo-López, MD, DSc (hc) Rancho Santa Fé, California

Dr. Grillo-López trained in hematology/oncology at the University of Puerto Rico. He was Program Director, Hematology/Oncology and held faculty appointments there and at the University of Michigan (Associate Professor of Medicine).

He has authored over 400 publications and coauthored the first international response criteria for lymphoma. Dr. Grillo-López has been instrumental in the development of over 25 anticancer agents.

He was Chief Medical Officer (IDEC Pharmaceuticals) responsible for the development of Rituxan and Zevalin (1st MAb and 1st radiolabeled MAb for cancer).

He has received numerous awards: DuPont-Merck's Total Quality Medical Research, Union of American Women's Medicine, Leukemia Society of America's Triumph, Cure for Lymphoma Foundation's Trailblazer, U. of California's Peter McCuen Cancer Research Excellence, Lymphoma Research Foundation's Evelyn Hoffman Memorial, Biotech CEOs' Best in Science, Discovery Health Channel's Medical Honors, Leukemia Lymphoma Soc.'s Health Hero Award, and others. He received the Hope Funds for Cancer Research Award for Excellence in Clinical Development for the development of the monoclonal antibody Rituxan; in 2008 the Tiedemann Award for Courage; and in 2015 the Order of Hope.

The U. of Puerto Rico School of Medicine granted Dr. Grillo-López the degree of Doctor in Scientific Investigations (honoris causa) in 2013. His current board service includes: UC San Diego Foundation, Moores UCSD Cancer Center, UCSD Preuss School, and Hope Funds for Cancer Research.

He was the Industry Representative to the Oncologic Drugs Advisory Committee (ODAC) of the FDA from 2003 to 2007.
