Donald "Dr. Don" Huntington is an accomplished ghostwriter, currently working on a number of projects. He has a background in theological studies, holding a baccalaureate degree, two masters' degrees, and a Doctor of Divinity degree in the field. Dr. Don has completed coursework for a PhD in Education and Computers in

Education at Michigan State University, and holds the D.Div degree from Golden State School of Theology. He spent 20 years as a technical writer in several Silicon Valley companies. He was co-founder of a lifestyle magazine and in 16 years more than 1,000 ghostwritten articles appeared in its pages.
