Kate has a special interest in patellofemoral dysfunction since she has suffered with the problem since she was



12 years old. She has undergone 8 painful knee surgeries and years of rehabilitation. After treating patellofemeral patients and researching the problem for the past 20 years, Kate and her associates developed the OnTrack System. This is a unique, non-surgical method for the management of patellofemoral dysfunction. Research has proven that the OnTrack is the only system that realigns the patella and can return the joint anatomy back to normal. Kate is proud to say that she and her team have successfully resolved thousands of patients' knee problems
