## ROTARY SCHOLARS AT USD'S KROC SCHOOL OF PEACE STUDIES: 20 YEARS OF BUILDING PEACE

What happens after students receive Rotary Scholarships to enroll in master's degree programs in the University of San Diego's Kroc School of Peace Studies (KSPS)? Do they actively build peace?

Does a Rotary Scholar's outreach in the service of peace justify his or her \$60,000 funding? Each Scholar receives a \$30,000 Rotary scholarship and a \$30,000 match scholarship from the Kroc School.

Steve Brown and Cynthia Villis surveyed the 34 international alumni from 21 countries who have received such Rotary Scholarships since 2002, seeking information about their experiences of their programs and their achievements since graduation. The information that they will share is a celebration of peacebuilding on the dusty ground of the Sudan and Somalia, to the highest level of law in Tanzania, to building low-income housing in China, and more.

Ms. Sharon Mwangi from Kenya is our District's current Rotary Scholar, enrolled in the master's degree program in Conflict Management and Resolution. Born and raised in central Kenya, Sharon's received her undergraduate degree in Sociology from Moi University. After completing an internship with the Kenya Red Cross, Sharon worked in humanitarian aid for Transparency International Kenya and for the Africa Voices Foundation. Her goal is to impact African communities in conflict, contributing to inter-agency collaboration to bring peace in Africa.

PDG Mel Gallegos and Judy Gallegos from the Rotary Club of San Diego Downtown Breakfast are Sharon's most excellent Rotary Host Counselors, accompanying her to our meeting today.
