USNS MERCY AND PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP

The MERCY is one of two US Navy hospital ships, and is based out of San Diego. This 1000 bed hospital ship would be the 8th largest in the world if on land, and is designed to provide full care for US Servicemen and women in times of conflict, but has secondary missions of performing civil affairs relief to US citizens as her crew did in 2020 at the beginning of the COVID Pandemic in Los Angeles (her sister ship, COMFORT performed this mission in NYC).

MERCY also performs a recurring humanitarian mission called Pacific Partnership, now in its 19th year. In the summer of 2022 MERCY deployed to Micronesia and the South Pacific to provide humanitarian relief to tens of thousands of denizens of this region.

CAPT Quast was the planning and executing Commanding Officer during this mission, departing MERCY upon his Change of Command and Retirement in Palau in July of 2022.
