The volcano semierupted with earthquakes and some unsettling moments. Ultimately it was actually fun, certainly fascinating.

Many Guests were introduced: Niki Brown, Chris Cieszko, Haslaw Elkins, Susie Callahan (Rancho Santa Fe Rotary Club), and Brian Zimmerman (La Jolla Sunrise Rotary Club) who is Assistant Governor with LJGTRC in his group of clubs. Brian was there with our special featured guest, District Governor Steve Weitzen who was making his official visit with the 'Most Dynamic Club in the World'.

We also reinducted **Sara Katz** back into the club after quite a few years absence as she built up her company in and outside of San Diego. Sara is one of the first women to join LJGTRC back in the late '80s and her many friends are very happy to welcome her back. DG Steve Weitzen served as inducting officer for Sara's rejoining.

Pam Russell then made a surprise announcement to the club. Pam is planning to move to Florida. Scheduled for March 10, Pam is moving to be close to her sister and Pam plans to join the Palm Beach Rotary Club. She joined the club in 1998, was President in '03-'04, and District Governor in '08-'09. She also serves as the Treasurer of the LJGTRC Foundation. We are definitely sorry to see her leave but wish her all the best in her new home.

DG Steve Weitzen made a strong, personal and compelling presentation on why he joined Rotary, what it has meant to him and why it is so important to the world. He also briefed the club on the Districtwide special service focus on Anti Human Trafficking.

Steve described how much he appreciates the strong record of La Jolla Golden Triangle Rotary and how many members of our club are District leaders. He noted that we have more Past District Governors than any other club - Steve Brown, Sandi Rimer, Louise Andres, Pam Russell. Many members are in District leadership -Khol (Membership), Brett Morev (Rose Parade Committee, Surfers Float United), Michael Bardin (Pathways to Peace & Anti-Human Trafficking Steering Committee), Kim Schafer (Anti-Human Trafficking Steering Committee). He also commended Emidio Conte for his great work as President (but not for his ties).

DG Steve described his journey with Rotary leading to his summary statement: "As much as you will change the lives of others, your life will also be changed even more." He then described the major Anti-Human Trafficking program he chose to feature during his year as DG. This near billion dollar business in our county is impacting so many young lives -- most of the victims are directly from here in our own neighborhoods. A \$70K Global Grant has been approved that is aimed at working with the US Attorney, the District Attorney and many area partners. More will be coming urging all clubs to become involved.
