.....Brian Lee The University Club The last meeting of the year for our club, on 12/15/23, was called to order by President Christy White Brook. Rotarian of the day was Dianne Day who joined our club in 1988. She talked about the Salk Institute where she worked for over 30 years, retiring in 2007 as Vice President of Development. Salk buildings, designed by Louis Kahn with input from Jonas Salk, were completed in 1966. The American Institute of Architects rated Salk one of the nation's top 10 buildings of the 20th century and declared it a historical landmark in 1991.

Some of the first fundraisers of the La Jolla Golden Triangle Rotary Club were held on the north lawn of the Institute. Most of the money raised was from dunking **Steve Brown** in the tank!

Jonas Salk developed the polio vaccine in the early 50's. He received the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1977 from President Jimmy Carter. His second significant achievement was founding the Salk Institute.

Dianne's major responsibility at Salk was fundraising and communications. The first addition to Salk, a 110,000 square foot building, was built in 1995. A second addition is being planned thanks to a \$100M matching grant provided by Joan and Irwin Jacobs.

Faculty and staff at Salk represent over 40 countries making it both a national and international institution. She highlighted some of the events she organized over the years: meetings with Princess Grace at the Palace of Monaco, with the owner of Chateau Margaux in France, with Queen Sylvia in Stockholm, and with dignitaries and royalty in Vienna. Interactions with celebrities included: organizing public service announcements with David Niven, Gregory Peck, Mary Tyler Moore, Louise Fletcher, and the filming of Mr. Jones where she interacted with Richard Gere and Lina Olin.

Dianne is proud to be a member of the Most Dynamic Club and thanked all the members for making the Club what it is today.

Steve Brown mentioned his trip to DC with Fary Moini with dinner at the Swiss Embassy and private dinner with three male hostages.

The speaker of the day was introduced by **Brett** Morey. Shaun Tomson has an extensive biography that includes Surfing at a professional level (former World Surfing Champion), lecturing on leadership and empowerment, and speaking on The Code Method that activates the power of purpose. He is a published author and co-wrote the award winning film Bustin' Down the Door. Purpose was defined as the commitment to accomplish something. Elements of purpose are: aspiration, inspiration, morality, and timeless. He wants to create a new sense of purpose around the world, believes that doing good is good for business (like owners of Patagonia do), and that one should strive to do a good turn today (and everyday).

President Christy adjourned the meeting at 8:30AM.
