Our Story

The original idea of creating an automotive museum in Balboa Park came from Briggs Cunningham, a renowned automobile col-

lector and racer. The idea circulated for many years until an inspired group of local automotive enthusiasts propelled the idea forward. In 1979, the San Diego City Council first considered the issue and in 1980 they gave unanimous approval to the museum and granted a long term lease for one of the historic buildings in the jewel of San Diego - Balboa Park.

After spending approximately \$1 million renovating and upgrading the building, the San Diego Automotive Museum opened in December of 1988. Since then millions of local auto enthusiasts and tourists from all over the world have visited our world-class collection. Today the museum stands as a living tribute to the automobile and what it has meant to our culture.

The San Diego Automotive Museum is a non-profit corporation under section 501(c)(3).

HYBRID MEETING COSTS

Jacquie reviewed the costs involved with the first hybrid LJGT Rotary Club meeting to be held on July 23. It will be held at the Marriott where the required minimum attendance has been set at 25. This level of attendance level must be maintained in order for the Marriott to provide the facilities and equipment needed for the club meetings. The board of directors stated all members in the club will be accessed \$6 per week, regardless of their attendance at the Marriott, and those attending will be charged \$19. This billing practice will continue to the end of September at which time it will be reviewed. Notifications will be sent out next Wednesday inquiring about your intent to attend the live meeting to ensure Marriott has preparations for all.

PROF SLOMANSON SPEAKER OF THE DAY

Jacquie introduced the speaker for the day. Professor William Slomanson, to speak on the evolution of international law regarding human rights. He started his presentation about evolution of human rights at 2.5 million years ago and guickly advanced to 1215 AD. It was there that contemporary human rights was written in the English Magna Carta. During the French Revolution of 1789, the Declaration of Rights of Men was written, stating that sovereignty was in the people not in the governing body. Then in 1776 slavery was written into the Declaration of Independence, but has now been corrected by the addition of amendments and articles to this document. He presented a slide showing the 4 Corners of the International Bill of Human Rights and discussed a few of the critical issues that brought about changes in the human rights laws. Of course, now, slavery still exists in other countries around the world. The slides

Professor Slomanson showed were detailed in that references were shown and those interested could Google them to obtain a more thorough understanding of his presentation.
