

He is the author of the book "Motivated To Act" as well as the multiple award-winning "Junga the Dancing Yeti" series of anti-bullying books and videos for children. He is working with educators to provide virtual and live presentations to primary school assemblies to motivate and assist children in overcoming bullying and other forms of neglect.

He is also a seasoned mortgage loan officer with Bank of America in San Diego. After growing up in Cleveland, Ohio, he lived in Los Angeles county for 25 years, back to Ohio for 2 years and settled into San Diego in 2019 with his fiance. He has one son in Santa Clarita.

Stephen joined Rotary last month and is a member of the Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators. As a Screen Actors Guild member, he has acted in films and television portraying one of the Wicked Witch's guards in Oz the Great and Powerful, and a teacher on GLEE.
