Our Rotarian of the Day was Rick Clark, who lead us in a Rotary prayer and then showed us a video montage that highlighted the impact that our club has had in Afghanistan. The rough estimate is that 47,000 young people in Jalalabad have been impacted though our efforts. The video was a poignant reminder of all that our club has accomplished and what ordinary Rotarians can achieve through fellowship, service, and the support of their friends and colleagues.

Announcements

Emidio reminded the club of the survey sent out by the incoming Social Committee to gauge the club's interest in further social outings and activities. The club is also having another social event on July 3rd at Emidio's hanger at Gillespie Field. We are also dark on the Friday before the July 4th weekend.

Jacquie Reily also reminded us that the Rotary
International Convention will be held virtually from June 12 to June 16, 2021.
Rotary International has also nominated Jennifer Jones to be the first women RI president in the history of Rotary International.
Kim Schaffer also reminded everyone that June 25 is going to the promote/demote ceremony.

Steve Brown advised the club that one of the people who was responsible for starting the club, George Carter Jessup, passed away. We are grateful to him for helping to start the Most Dynamic Rotary Club in the World. Bev Frischner also reminded us that the District Governor's Diner and Promote/Demote was on calendar for June 28 and that there are tickets available.

Fary Moini also announced that due to the gracious donations of Jan Percival, Linda Stouffer-Wallace, and other Rotarians, they were able to open up the computer labs in the school in Afghanistan for three months during the summer, which were not able to open due to funding issues. Fary also wanted to thank Bill Busch who is helping to train these young women on how to start a business and Rick Clark and Cynthia Villas who have been working with the young students.

Nancy Gatschet also announce our upcoming fundraiser on September 25 at 4:00 p.m, which will be the Quintessential Fly In. This will be a party like none of us have experienced and will be aimed at raising a lot of money to fund our various projects. There will be lots of unique prizes available to attendees.

Presentation of the Day

Our presentation this week was by Tim Pinkney, a fellow Rotarian and member of IFFr (International Fellowship of Flying Rotarians). Tim is a currently a NASA Solar System Ambassador.

Tim presented an engaging presentation on the Perseverance Mission that is being conducted on Mars. The mission is the successor to the Curiosity Mars rover. Tim provided an overview of the history of Mars exploration and the complexities involved in landing on Mars. Tim also taught us about Ingenuity, the first helicopter, to successfully fly on another planet. The Perseverance Mission landed in Jezero Crater on the Red Planet on February 18, 2021. Perseverance is the most sophisticated rover NASA has sent to Mars searching for signs of ancient microbial life and beginning to pave the way for human exploration beyond the Moon. It should not be long before the first Rotary Club is established on another planet.


