Rotary Meeting 6/18/21

- ◆ President Emidio welcomed our Rotarian of the Day, Bradley Day. Most of us know Bradley from his attendance at our Club as a Rotaractor. Bradley's invocation spoke about gratitude for the world around us and people in our lives and living a life of Service. We all then recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
- ◆ Bradley shared his screen about his Rotary journey. In high school he developed a desire to serve and after being asked by his friend Emily, joined her Interact Club where he became secretary. At UCSD, he became a Rotaract and attended several Rotary meeting and participated in many projects. At our club, he learned what Rotary was all about. After graduating, he joined the Pacific Beach Rotaract Club and became the District Rotaract Representative. In 2 weeks, he hopes to join Rotary as a red Badger.
- There were no guests present at today's meeting.
- ♦ The fine mistresses, Lori and Sharon, had nothing to report but mention was made of Rick Binder's recent event. He gave a high \$5 for being married for 2 weeks in spite of people saying it wouldn't last. Rick and Janine were married on June 4th in Maui. Congrats to both of them.
- Kim Schafer gave a high \$10 for her niece who is in the Olympic swimming trials in which she competes tonight.
- ◆ Chris Richards gave a high \$5 to Pete Ballanitine for making it to the newspaper for his work with veterans. There was an event last Monday of the US Midway where 6 guitars were given to 6 vets.
- Dr. Antonio Grillo gave a high \$5 for his granddaughter who made it into the top 5 (out of 14,000 scholars)

- of an international competition where the winner becomes CEO of an international company for a month. This is Tony's daughter.
- ◆ Eric Mjoen gave a high \$5 for his daughter who graduated from middle school with a biliteracy award in Spanish and English.
- Nancy Gatschet gave a high \$10 for being able to travel to the East coast to see her son and grandson.
- Announcements came from Emidio first, who reminded everyone that next Monday was Merlot Monday in Noble Park.
- ◆ The next meeting will include the Promote/Demote and will be Emidio's last meeting. If anyone has any dirt or pleasantries on Emidio, please contact Lori or Kim.
- A reminder that July 2nd will be dark, so no meeting.
- Also a reminder that on July 3rd, there will be a party at Emidio's hanger. Please RSVP if you are going.
- Jacquie reported from the Marriott where they were supposed to have a trial run for a live meeting but the Marriott failed to provide the necessary equipment. They are hoping to be live on July 23rd.
- She also reminded everyone that June 28th is the Governor's dinner at the Del Mar Hilton. There are 18 spaces left and the cost is \$50.00. You can sign up on line.
- Steve Brown who is on the International Polio Plus Committee, reported on a tragedy in Afghanistan which involved the shooting of several polio plus workers at 5 separate sites where it was released that there were both dead and injured workers. The motive is unknown. Immunization of children is suspended for now.
- Next was our speaker, Dr. Antonio Grillo- Lopez who gave us an up-date on Covid 19. His full presentation is on the Rotary Website. He has done 32 presentations and this one is his presentation from Kampala, Uganda. All publications on Covid are in the National Library of Medicine and in January 2020 there were no publications and as of June 2021, there are 145,651 publications showing that the scientific literature is growing. His main focus was on the fact that everyone should get vaccinated. Pfizer, Moderna and J& J have all been approved in the US with other vaccines on the horizon. A common question now, is if one shot is enough and the answer is that with 2 shots you increase your immunity by 4-6 fold. Fully vaccinated people in the US is 44.1%. 52.7% have received one shot. Vaccinations are declining and over 1,000,000 Americans remain unvaccinated. CDC Guidance comes from Dr. R. Walensky. MD, MPH, office of Director, who is highly qualified and reports to HHR and the President. Vaccine protection with 1 dose is 52%, with 2 doses is 95% and with Serious Covid is 90%. Vaccinated people can still carry the virus but chances are low in spreading the virus. People who are fully vaccinated, must use common sense in following precautions. No one knows how long the protection lasts. Even though the no mask mandate went into effect on June 15th, restrictions still apply in many places, such as nursing homes, hospitals, airplanes, etc. We have not reached herd immunity which is 80% immunized. We need to continue to protect ourselves until that is reached.
- Emidio closed the meeting with a couple of quotes, one being from Mark Twain, "The secret of getting ahead is getting started".

ANTONIO J. GRILLO-LÓPEZ



Dr. Grillo-López trained in hematology/ oncology at the University of Puerto Rico. He was Program Director, Hematology/Oncology and held faculty appointments there and at the University of Michigan (Associate Professor of Medicine). He has authored over 400 publications and co-authored the first international response criteria for lymphoma. Dr. Grillo-López has been instrumental in the development of over 25 anticancer agents. He was Chief Medical Officer (IDEC Pharmaceuticals) responsible for the development of Rituxan and Zevalin (1st MAb and 1st ra-

diolabeled MAb for cancer). He has received numerous awards: DuPont-Merck's Total Quality Medical Research, Union of American Women's Medicine, Leukemia Society of America's Triumph, Cure for Lymphoma Foundation's Trailblazer, U. of California's Peter McCuen Cancer Research Excellence, Lymphoma Research Foundation's Evelyn Hoffman Memorial, Biotech CEOs' Best in Science, Discovery Health Channel's Medical Honors, Leukemia Lymphoma Soc.'s Health Hero Award, and others. He received the Hope Funds for Cancer Research Award for Excellence in Clinical Development for the development of the monoclonal antibody Rituxan; in 2008 the Tiedemann Award for Courage; and in 2015 the Order of Hope. The U. of Puerto Rico School of Medicine granted Dr. Grillo-López the degree of Doctor in Scientific Investigations (honoris causa) in 2013. He has served on several boards including: National Coalition for Cancer Survivorship, UC San Diego Foundation, Moores UCSD Cancer Center, Preuss School, and Hope Funds for Cancer Research. He was the Industry Representative to the Oncologic Drugs Advisory Committee (ODAC) of the FDA from 2003 to 2007.
