Irene moved to Carlsbad from Mexico with her very large family and at age 5 underwent heart surgery. From ages 6-13 she endured physical abuse from an older brother while her parents were denying the entire situation.

Finally, at age 13 she was taken out of the home and placed into foster care in a group home with home schooling. She convinced her foster parents to let her go to public school and at Carlsbad High School (where she met her husband) she joined the debating team and won a Rotary competition.

Thru this connection she studied in France and began an exotic life of travels with the aid of Rotary. She returned to the US and graduated UCSD with a degree in dance from UCSD.

The rest of Irene's journey has been a combination of entrepreneurship and giving back to other kids with a foster care background. During the most difficult times of her life, she sustained herself by journaling. She has developed a business in creating guided journals in topics like wellness, Christianity and many other topics.

She is a major advocate for neglected and fostered children. She lives with her husband and 4 children and has an incredibly full life.

Nancy closed the meeting with her song of the day, "Paperback Writer."
