MATT SHILLINGBURG



Matt Shillingburg was born Portsmouth Naval Hospital into a Navy Family. His Grandfather, on Father's side fought in the Spanish American War, His Father was a "Frogman" with UDT Team 1 in Little Creek, Va and his Grandfather, Russel Stout, on his Mother's side as a Pearl Harbor Survivor and served for over 30 years in the Navy.

Matt moved with his Navy Family and settled in Imperial Beach, California in 1959 where he lived with his family till he joined the service in August of 1974.

Matt served honorably in the United States Army, entering the service as an enlisted Private, E-1 and retiring as the Senior Military Intelligence Officer, S2 for the 3rd Armor Calvary Regiment with over 20 years (1974 - 1996) of Military Service, which allowed him to travel to over 18 different countries around the world.

He is also a 100% Service-connected Disabled Veteran, as rated by the Veterans Administration with an Honorable Discharge.

Matt held a Top Secret (TS), Special Background Investigation (SBI) with Sensitive Compartmented Access (SCI) as a United States Army Intelligence Officer.

He was a **"Mustang"** United States Army Officer and was fortunate to have served in many diverse areas and specialties during his career.

He has been serving the community all his life, Paperboy, Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Service Member, Blood Donor, Veteran's Advocate, etc.
