

THE USS MIDWAY STORY

A short presentation about how the USS Midway aircraft carrier become the 5th most popular museum of any type in the United States (35,000 museums). We'll discuss what draws over a million visitors annually, and understand how the USS Midway has become one of San Diego's most valued community resources and America's living symbol of freedom.

Docent Andy Hill has been a USS Midway Museum volunteer since 2006 and is currently a Docent Watch Shift Leader, public speaker, and co-chair of the Docent Continuing Education program.

Lieutenant Commander Hill is a Gulf War veteran having served 27 years in the U.S. Navy aboard nuclear-powered aircraft carriers. As a surface warfare officer, he specialized in naval nuclear propulsion. After his Navy retirement, he worked in the defense industry as a Senior Principal Engineer for L-3 Communications, developing military mission application software, and recently retired from a long career in civil service as an Engineer and acquisition professional with the U.S. Army.

A native of Tennessee, Andy holds a Bachelor of Science in Electronic Systems Technology. His personal interests include maritime technology and military history.
