After our now traditional 15 minutes in breakout rooms for socializing, **President Emidio Del Conte** called us to order as the Most Dynamic Club in the world! He called our Rotarian of the Day Garry Kachkovsky to begin the meeting. Garry asked us for a moment silence for those who have been impacted by the pandemic. He then led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. Garry joined our club in October of 2017. He was born in Russia (behind the Iron Curtain), and in 1985, his family migrated to Chicago where he lived for the next 12 years. He graduated from Illinois Wesleyan University with a dual major in Economics and Russian Studies. Not enjoying the winters in Illinois, he moved to Arizona and started his career in financial services. When his firm merged with a larger firm. Garry found that opening his own firm with a partner would allow him to deal with his clients in his own way, and Kachkovsky Fisher (Registered Investment Advisors) was born in 2001. Struggled for a few years but his time in Russia had prepared him for this and eventually built a thriving business, with offices nationally. He met his life partner in 2004 in Scottsdale, and together they moved to San Diego in

2017 with their 2 daughters Ava & Elle. Fast forward to surviving the pandemic with 2 young girls – the family went back to nature: hiking, biking, camping, and developing hobbies like cooking, rescuing reptiles, and making slime (huge mess!). Garry has created a garage gym – which even the girls enjoy! Next project is a remodel. Considering his firm, Garry reminded us that being a financial advisor is more complex just than picking stocks and bonds. His firm uses lots of options to help their clients become financially secure.

Emidio thanked Garry and welcomed guests. Omolara McCloud is a CPA in La Jolla and was a Rotary member in Decatur AL about 2 years ago. Bob and Diane from Gainesville FL were welcomed and shared that Fary Moini would be speaking to their Club at an upcoming meeting.

Fine Master Lori Bende fined our Rotarian of the Day Garry \$2 for today being one of only 2x that he has showed his real face on our Zoom meetings. Emidio announced the meeting of the Vocational Meeting immediately following this meeting, and to hold the week of April 19 as open as possible for Career Day at Preuss. Emidio spoke of the recent survey monkey on the possibilities for future meetings with 41 responses. 80% are open to meeting again at the Marriott, 90% open to some combo of meeting types/venues, 76% in favor of some indoor and some outdoor. high point for **Emidio** is that **Bob** and his 2 sons are all Navy SEALs and, like their father, are both Captains. It may be a first in Navy history that one family has 3 SEALs and 3 Captains! Not in his bio is the fact that he saved many homes in their mutual neighborhood during the Cedar Fire in 2003. **Emidio** invited **Bob Rohrbach** to the virtual podium to much virtual applause!

Bob started by saying how lucky he felt, only 3 months after SEAL training to be selected for the Apollo 11 recovery team and sent to Hawaii. **Bob** was a backup swimmer for Apollo 11. Shepard, Roosa, and Mitchell were to be the astronauts on Apollo 14 and trained with the recovery team. **Bob** shared many photos of the recovery team, including the lead swimmer who was an Olympic swimmer. He explained how the extra-heavy wet suit protected them from the high water temperature and the fuels in the water. Bob explained the tradition when crossing the equator, a new SEAL goes from a polliwog to a shellback. A SEAL is required to kiss the "royal baby". When crossing, SEALs are beaten with rubber hoses. Bob grabbed a companion and asked him to head-butt (along with

himself) the royal baby. He fell off his throne and great madness ensued with Bob and his buddy getting tossed into a tank of odiferous material! Back to work! They laid out all materials for the recovery on the hangar deck and practiced this every day. They trained astronauts on the exit routine – on the ground, in the bay and in the ocean. They checked materials every day for days on end prior to going live. They had 6 backups for everything. The doctor for the crew wanted to experience everything the astronauts would, including jumping out of the helicopter. Bob told him to hold his legs together when he jumped, but he did not and landed in the ocean from 40 feet up and when he got into the raft, he was a bit SORE! The team spoke constantly about communications, communications, communications. Always worked in practice. But on the day of recovery, did not work. But the good news is that **Bob** had worked out hand-signals for egress if communications did not function. He spoke of how the team played jokes on each other. Every man had to practice every job so that there would be backup for everything. Bob showed photos of practices and stuff they designed after Apollo

11, like weighted bags to secure the raft in the water under helicopters.

Bob's description and photos from the actual recovery were riveting and bought this event from almost 50 years ago to life. And remember the bag **Bob** had brought with him the actual day of recovery? It held a bottle of Champagne, which was popped and shared by his team when the carrier hid them from view! Any incredible story! **Bob** was thanked by many in the Club for such an exhilarating presentation!

Since the presentation ran just a little overtime, there were only a few questions allowed, then Emidio reminded the group of the Vocational Committee meeting. Emidio announced that Pete Griffith would be the Rotarian of the Day next week, and Dan Sheehan our speaker on "Redefining the Warrior's Journey". Emidio closed with these thoughts: **Norman Vincent Peale** "Change your thoughts and you change your world" and from Robert Frost: "The only way out is through."


