SYLVIA WHITLOCK



Women in Rotary An inspirational presentation by the First Woman President worldwide, in Rotary International

Sylvia Whitlock was District Governor for Rotary in 2012-2013 after holding every office at club level. She chaired the Four-Way Test Speech competition for 6 years, served on the District Finance Committee and many other duties.

After attending high school in Kingston, Jamaica, she received a B.A. in Psychology, M.A. in Education, PH. D. Education and M.A. in Marriage and Family Therapy from various institutions.

Sylvia developed Rotary clubs in England, Scotland, the Caribbean, Australia, South Africa and India and was the first woman President worldwide in Rotary International.

She has received numerous accolades during her years of Rotary service and earned the distinction of having an International Award presented to her in 2017 with her namesake.

She is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow, a Benefactor and Member of the Bequest Society, a Major Donor with Rotary and has spoken at more than 100 District Conferences.

Following Pledge of Allegiance, David stated the importance of world peace, especially with what is happening in Ukraine. He highlighted Rotary's Pathway to Peace initiative, measure of global (negative) peace; pillars of positive peace; sustaining world peace. Concluded by thanking everyone for 35 years of Rotary! Jacquie thanked David for his service in Rotary and making a difference in world peace. She also apologized for "Murphy being at work" today!

Stephen Tako introduced guests. There were several today. Lori Bende introduced her family members and thanked everyone for helping with Girls Scout Cookies 2022 sale. Christy White introduced Ron, who is a retired police detective. Marty Rosenstein introduced Sharon, his wonderful wife. He was overcome by her beauty and went totally speechless! We had a visiting Rotarian, Danny, from the Carlsbad Hi-Noon Rotary Club. He mentioned that his club is doing a fundraiser for scholarships (raffle tickets are six for \$100 and \$20 for one) for students going to universities, trade and technical schools, etc. David Chnog introduced his wife, Sarah. Amy Shapiro, Marty's daughter, was also in attendance (via Zoom).

Announcements: **President Jacquie** mentioned that **David Tansey** is hosting a Pathway to Peace committee meeting immediately following this meeting. The Road Rally is scheduled for 21st May. Alex Monroe (via Zoom) mentioned that a 2.5-mile Rotary Walk is planned for 6th March, starting at 10:00 AM, starting from San Dieguito River in Del Mar, with a lunch and beverage stop at view point. Please contact Alex for more information.

Rick Clark talked about the upcoming police project and encouraged everyone to sign up. He needs to get the count within the next week or so. 25 Rotarians have already signed up. In the signup sheet (on the table) specify your availability for 19th or 26th March or both. The scope of work will involve complete remodeling of kitchen, awning over the patio, lots of painting, etc. **Mike Bardin** pointed out that there is District Assembly on the 19th March.

Rich Papike fined Marty and Eric. High fives included: Lori thanking our club for supporting the Girl Scout Cookie drive; Christy White thanked Ron for attending today's meeting and for his service; Rich thanked Bradley for helping with his Power Point presentation for his next week's ROTD speech.

As mentioned earlier, today is David Tansey's day! Our speaker, David Tansey, started by stating that, as a humanitarian organization, for RI, peace is a cornerstone of its mission. When people work to create peace in their communities, that change can have a global effect. RI implements its mission thru the Pathways to Peace committee at the club level. The purpose of this Committee is to: Engage, educate, and empower Rotarians to achieve peace objectives; Raise Rotary's profile as a community and world peacebuilder; and Demonstrate support for Rotary Peace Centers and Fellows. The committee annually organizes the promotion, selection, and presentation of the club's annual Peacebuilder of the Year Award. David introduced Marty Rosenstein as the first recipient of the Peacebuilder Award for the Year 2022.

Marty started by stating that he was born into a place where there was abundance and opportunity. He soon realized that there were many others not so fortunate and felt the need to do something for them. He found Rotary to be the obvious choice to accomplishing his goals. He was inspired by everyday goodness and kindness of so many people, including his wife, Sharon, and friend Denny Jacobs.

After joining Rotary in 1975, he served 2 terms as president, the first time at 31 (just like Alex Monroe). He continues to play an active role in such programs as, Gift of Life, Student of the Month, original Pathways to Peace committee in the District, Rotary Model UN Program, AIDS Orphan Relief project in South Africa. He dearly enjoys working with youth at all levels - Earlyact, Interact and Rotaract programs both locally in San Diego as well as internationally (in India and Afghanistan). He gets his greatest pleasure from sparking the involvement of young people. He concluded his presentation by sharing a story of Luwan, a former Preuss Interact student from Sudan, who is now is completing her medical residency.

Following Marty, David introduced

Sarah Saluta - the second recipient of the Peacebuilder Award for the Year 2022. Sarah is the Executive Director at San Diego Cooperative Charter School (SDCCS) in Linda Vista. SDCCS is a tuition-free charter school that accepts children from anywhere in San Diego County. Programs at SDCCS include the highest standards of academic excellence as well as such areas as gardening, cooking, dance, music, art, Science lab, 3D art, PE and ballroom dance. Students have many ballroom dance performances at various venues throughout the county including one at a senior living assisted care facility. It is a great way to teach manners in addition to physical work out. It is a school where teachers, community and students embrace one another to cultivate academic excellence and to create connection between curriculum and the outside world. They have chicken, ducks and rabbits (?)!!

For the last 15 years, the school has been celebrating international day of peace every year, where students make signs, sing and dance. It culminates in a march thru the community. She thanked **Marty** and **Fary** for making a significant contribution with the EarlyAct program for the students at her school. The EarlyAct program has been a very successful program, where 3rd graders were engaged in a drive to collect clothes for families in Mexico. Sarah concluded her presentation with few pictures of the Most Dynamic EarlyAct Club in the World!

As the final act of today's meeting, **President Jacquie** presented the Peacemaker of the Year Award to **Marty** and **Sarah**. A picture is always worth 1,000 words!
