Finally, I had the pleasure of introducing this week's speaker: **Mike Eastwood. Mike** and his wife, Jenny, are the owners and operators of Small Goods in La Jolla. The meat & cheese shop has served as a refuge for the local community in what has proven to be an extremely trying time.

After successful careers in movie production, **Mike** and **Jenny** moved from New York City back to Australia. It was there that the idea for Small Goods was born. As charcuterie is to the French, *"small goods"* are to the Australians. Upon arriving in San Diego, the duo worked the Farmers' Market circuit to expand their reach. After settling on a brick-and-mortar location on La Jolla Boulevard, they opened their shop in early February of 2020. Not long after that, the real struggle began.

For the next 4 months, Small Goods was the only shop open in the immediate area. Opening a small business is a difficult task in a normalized economic environment. In a global pandemic, it is a seemingly insurmountable task. However, **Mike** and **Jenny** pushed on.

Inspired by their affinity for local farmers and their essential offerings (Jenny was born in Peoria, IL), they invited vendors to open pop-up shops in front of their store. Not only were they able to support growers who would otherwise potentially cease operations, but they were provided locals with a COVID- safe shopping experience.

After 85 pop-ups and 1000s of sociallydistanced customers served, Small Goods is still open today. The shop is located at 7524 La Jolla Blvd, La Jolla, CA 92037, serving everything from salads & sandwiches to coffee & pastries. The hours are Tues-Sat 9-5ish Thurs/Fri till 6.

Mike concluded by appealing to the club with a message of compassion and understanding. Small businesses have been tested beyond belief in the last year. He requested that we consumers support them with our dollars and accommodate them with our kindness.
