Assistant Governor **David Oates** shared a work project opportunity on June 10 working with Generate Hope to clean up a recovery home in the South Bay.

Kevin Carlson updated us on the police project. Carpet will be installed next month.

Chris Muhart introduced our speaker Oli Bachie, PhD who she met at Model UN where he was a guest speaker.

Oli Bachie talked to us about global food insecurity and its disproportionate impact on women. More than 34 million people experience food insecurity which is the lack of consistent access to enough food for every person in a household to live an active, healthy life. There is a huge

gender inequality and uneven distribution of resources and privileges among gender. As gender inequality increased across 109 countries so did food insecurity. In 2021, 59% of those globally affected by hunger were women. More women reported eating smaller portions or skipped meals altogether.

Major causes of food insecurity include poverty, poor economy, unemployment, low income, food shortage, uneven distribution and lack of access to food, chronic health conditions or lack of access to healthcare, war and conflict, climate change, poor nutrition, poor public policy, and systemic racism and racial discrimination.

There are many ways to overcome food insecurity including supporting agricultural transformation and enabling women farmers to exercise their rights, solving the underlying causes, eliminating gender-based food insecurity, moving out of primitive fuel source to ecologically resilient source, moving from wood biomass as energy (fuel wood) to solar cooking tools and reducing deforestation, and introducing regenerative practices/ ecosystem integration that meet the needs of the community. Federal nutrition programs also play a critical role in mitigating food insecurity.
