Will Moore introduced our speaker, Ed Clancy of Pedal Ahead: E-bikes for Everyone! Pedal Ahead is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that incentivizes the use of electric bikes (e-bikes) to make it easier for people to travel throughout their communities.

The initiative will enhance quality of life for a variety of people – those that are transit-dependent and in need of additional travel options as well as people

who want to reduce their reliance on driving for neighborhood trips while better connecting to regional transit services. Riding an e-bike is a great way to get to work, school, shopping, and other destinations while supporting health and wellbeing.

Pedal Ahead prioritizes e-bike distribution to lower-income applicants (annual income of approximately \$50,000 or below) while providing quality-of-life enhancements through physical, mental, and environmental health.

President Nancy announced that in Marty Rosenstein's absence, she was delighted to introduced our guests from the Preuss School: Holly Mak, Stacy's teacher, her counsellor, her mother and finally **Stacy Doninguez** – our Student of the Month! Stacy gave a moving, emotional presentation of her journey to becoming a good student and finding a path forward that motivates her. She was told that Marty would visit the school to present her certificate in her advisory class for all to see.

After announcing next week's program, Nancy closed the meeting with the start of "Here Comes the Sun" from the Beatles, and a brief reminder that "Gratitude is happiness doubled by wonder!"

This included two deployments to Vietnam as Engineering Officer with the Seabees, experiencing the enemy action of the infamous TET Offensive of 1968.

He met his future wife, Nilsa, while deployed to Puerto Rico and they were married in 1971. They have one son, Javier, and a daughter-in-law, Dawne.

Rick and his business partner, Howard Schuss, had an architectural practice for thirty-one years completing more than 2,000 residential and commercial projects in about 20 states. They retired on Rick's birthday, December 31, 2015.

At the invitation of club jester, Rich Papike, Rick joined the La Jolla Golden Triangle Rotary Club in 1992. He served as club president and has been involved in helping to organize more than 35 LJGT club volunteer hands-on work projects in San Diego, Rosarito Beach, Mexico and Camp Pendleton, as well as producing scores of videos showcasing our amazing organization. Among his Rotary Awards are club Rotarian of the Year, Foundation District Service Award, Governor's Leadership Award, Governor's Visionary Award, District Governor's 'Super Hero Award', Rotary International Avenues of Service Citation and was presented the "Key to the City" of Rosarito Beach, Mexico for organizing ten years of 'Navidad en Noviembre', refurbishing schools there.

His most rewarding Rotary activities, however, were working with Fary Moini and Steve Brown in designing education facilities built in Jalalabad, Afghanistan, affecting tens of thousands of young Afghan students.
