PEDAL AHEAD: E-BIKES FOR EVERYONE

Pedal Ahead is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that incentivizes the use of electric bikes (e-bikes) to make it easier for people to travel throughout their communities. The initiative will enhance quality of life for a variety of people – those that are transit-dependent and in need of additional travel options as well as people who want to reduce their reliance on driving for neighborhood trips while better connecting to regional transit services. Riding an e-bike is a great way to get to work, school, shopping, and other destinations while supporting health and well-being.

Pedal Ahead prioritizes e-bike distribution to lower-income applicants (annual income of approximately \$50,000 or below) while providing quality-of-life enhancements through physical, mental, and environmental health.

Beginning in fall 2022, the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) will support the recruitment of up to 125 new participants to help us better understand how e-bikes enhance quality of life while expanding access to destinations in the San Diego region.

Ed Clancy a US Army Veteran and the President and Founder of Pedal Ahead. He is also a board member of Veterans Community Connection, which supports veterans and family members transitioning to civilian life.

He attended University of Baltimore and Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, MD and has a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science/Government and Public Policy. In his free time he competes in Ironman triathalons and he coaches and plays ice hockey.

PROFESSIONAL: Retired from Scripps Health. After 32 years with Scripps Health, much of it as Chief Public Policy Officer, retired in 2018. Career in public relations, public affairs and government relations began with four years in the Navy as a Public Affairs Officer, continued as VP Public Relations for Phillips-Ramsey, then San Diego's largest advertising and public relations agency, and ultimately to Scripps. Continuing to consult. Currently on two boards (San Diego OASIS and the Community Health Improvement Partners). Graduated from Stanford University.

FAMILY: Sixth-generation Californians. The Bardin Family in California dates to the mid-1850s when my great, great grandfather traveled by wagon train across the Oregon and California Emigrant Trails eventually settling in Salinas. My mother is also part of a family that dates back to the 1880s in the San Francisco area. I grew up in Berkeley. My wife Arlene (retired registered nurse) and I met in San Francisco in 1965 and we just celebrated our 56th anniversary. We moved to San Diego in 1969 and raised our family here. Today, each of our two daughters and their husbands (one pair - Stanford graduates, the other pair - UCLA graduates) live in the Silicon Valley (Los Altos and San Carlos), two granddaughters graduated from the University of Colorado at Boulder and their brother is a junior at U. of Colorado. Another grandson is at UC Davis heading for veterinary medicine and our youngest grandson is junior in high school.
