Turin 1911: The World's Fair in Italy is the first digital project devoted to the only universal exposition ever held in Italy. Though World's fairs were among the West's largest mass-attended events, they were also ephemeral occurrences designed to exhibit, rather than preserve, the changing world of modernity. Turin 1911 was no exception. Once the Fair was dismantled, its artifacts were scattered among institutional archives and private collectors, thus failing to be studied in a systematic manner.

The Turin 1911 project is a partnership between experts in humanities, architects, engineers, and computer scientists of the School of Arts & Humanities and the Cultural Heritage Engineering Initiative (CHEI) at the Qualcomm Institute of the Jacobs School of Engineering at UC San Diego, and the Laboratory of Geomatics for Cultural Heritage of the Polytechnic University of Turin, Italy.

Special tribute was given to Kathleen Tansey who is one of the founders., Steve Brown, President of Jalabad project, Fary Moini for amazing work with Sister Cities, and Nancy Gatchet, service in Rotary and involvement with project in Kenja. Sister Citis is 65 years old and has diplomats from 24 cities across 23 countries. Sister Cities International is in 140 countries and has 2.000 partnerships around the world. The founder is President Eisenhauer, created to foster peace. The Project in San Diego started 66 years ago when Hiroshima happened. Japanese Peace Garden resulted. Jalabad has been amazing project. Girls are now getting an education. 2019 we did a water project in Maasai, Kenya. Drilled a well at school to provide water . Promoted growth of school and children could bring back water to their family. Now water is provided to over 7,000 people. There is now an educational center that was created primarily with Club 33. Students travel to Maasai to get education. They were provided with computers, electricity and environmental work. United Nations trip presented environmental program and advocated for Maasai, They just got their land rights back. Another project in progress is piped in water to the education center and community. Also they have put in a filtration system. Can bottle and sell bottled water. All of this provides jobs for women and gives them economic empowerment. Maasai saying "Before we have Peace, we have Conflict". Due to conflict and resolution , we have peace. Tim Stiven, Chairman of Sister Cities, San Diego, connects with Maasai and girls in Afghanistan. He just contracted with a school in SD for girls in Afghanistan to get a California

Christy told Jessica they were making a donation in her name to Just in Time for Foster Youth and also presented her with our famous mug, The meeting was then adjourned.
