them to speak to our Club. Luke introduced Tom Gotfredson (Rich Papike's sponsor) who is the first in the speaker series. Tom is with Blanchard Krasner & French. He has 39 years' experience in estate planning, real property law, and business transactions. Tom shared some potential estate plan changes if Joe Biden were to be elected.

Nancy introduced our speaker Lisa Larkin who spoke to us about drug development. Lisa has over 14 years' experience working with leading research universities and dynamic biopharmaceutical companies. The big picture... On average it takes 12 to 15 years to bring a drug to market and the cost is about a billion dollars. A large number of prospective drugs will never make it to market. There are two key players. The first player is the FDA. The FDA is responsible for protecting and promoting public health. The second player is the top 20 global pharmaceutical companies. The process consists of five stages: 1. discovery and development, 2. preclinical research, 3. clinical development, 4. FDA review, and 5. post-market monitoring.

Jacquie, a blonde before the pandemic, ended the meeting with a blonde joke.
