### THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AND TODAY'S LAW ENFORCEMENT CHALLENGES

Undersheriff Kelly Martinez has been serving the people of San Diego County as a deputy sheriff since 1985. Kelly has risen through the ranks holding positions as deputy, sergeant, lieutenant, captain, commander, Assistant Sheriff and was appointed as the Undersheriff in February of 2021.

As Undersheriff she serves as the chief deputy of the elected sheriff overseeing all department operations and ensuring San Diego County remains the safest urban county in the nation. She is responsible for the department's \$1 billion budget and 4,600 authorized employees. The men and women of the San Diego County Sheriff's Department operate 21 patrol stations and substations, seven detentions facilities, seven Superior Court facilities and the related Civil Division, a nationally accredited Crime Laboratory, and other functions necessary to provide for public safety throughout San Diego County.

Undersheriff Martinez is a member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the San Diego Police Chiefs' and Sheriff's Association, and a lifetime member of the California State Sheriff's Association. She is a San Diego native and committed to public safety. Undersheriff Martinez is married with one adult son. She counts travel and boating as her favorite activities.
