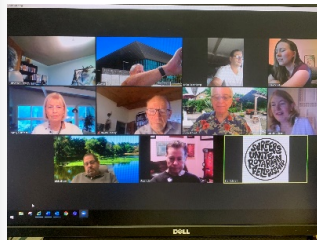

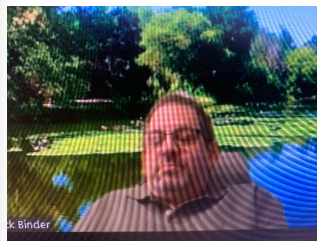

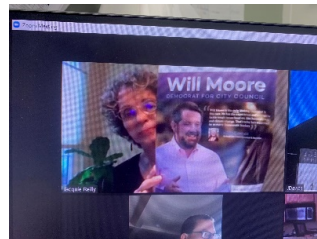

Jacquie gives some kudos to our own Will Moore as he seeks office this November.



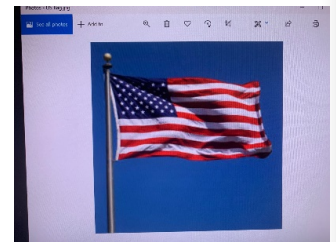
Is it the camera angle or is Alex going large on his coffee these

Happily retired, I'm busier than I've ever been! Of course, there's Rotary – you all know what I do here! I serve on the Boards of two non-profits – one local and one national. I am a grandmother – one granddaughter here (lots of time with this 5-year-old!) and one grandson (11) on the east coast in North Carolina.
